

## John 9:1-17 New Living Translation

### Jesus Heals a Man Born Blind

**1** As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth. **2** “Rabbi,” his disciples asked him, “why was this man born blind? Was it because of his own sins or his parents’ sins?” **3** “It was not because of his sins or his parents’ sins,” Jesus answered. “This happened so the power of God could be seen in him. **4** We must quickly carry out the tasks assigned us by the one who sent us.<sup>[a]</sup> The night is coming, and then no one can work. **5** But while I am here in the world, I am the light of the world.” **6** Then he spit on the ground, made mud with the saliva, and spread the mud over the blind man’s eyes. **7** He told him, “Go wash yourself in the pool of Siloam” (Siloam means “sent”). So the man went and washed and came back seeing! **8** His neighbors and others who knew him as a blind beggar asked each other, “Isn’t this the man who used to sit and beg?” **9** Some said he was, and others said, “No, he just looks like him!” But the beggar kept saying, “Yes, I am the same one!” **10** They asked, “Who healed you? What happened?” **11** He told them, “The man they call Jesus made mud and spread it over my eyes and told me, ‘Go to the pool of Siloam and wash yourself.’ So I went and washed, and now I can see!” **12** “Where is he now?” they asked. “I don’t know,” he replied. **13** Then they took the man who had been blind to the Pharisees, **14** because it was on the Sabbath that Jesus had made the mud and healed him. **15** The Pharisees asked the man all about it. So he told them, “He put the mud over my eyes, and when I washed it away, I could see!” **16** Some of the Pharisees said, “This man Jesus is not from God, for he is working on the Sabbath.” Others said, “But how could an ordinary sinner do such miraculous signs?” So there was a deep division of opinion among them. **17** Then the Pharisees again questioned the man who had been blind and demanded, “What’s your opinion about this man who healed you?” The man replied, “I think he must be a prophet.”
